- 1. Regardless of individual course grades, students must maintain a minimum 2.75 cumulative GPA.
- Some colleges require a minimum GPA for major courses. Courses indicated below are included in the major GPA for this program of study. A 3.0 GPA must be achieved in all education courses.
- The <u>Carolina Core</u> provides the common core of knowledge, skill and academic experience for all Carolina undergraduate students. Although students may take up to 43 hours to meet all Carolina Core requirements, students in the Elementary Education program must complete two Carolina Core approved "overlay-eligible" courses in order to graduate on time and avoid summer courses or taking more than five courses in some semesters.
 Complete 10 hours in science (at least one course must include a lab). One Life Science, one Physical Science and one Earth Science are required.

- 5. The Carolina Core requires either two approved courses in one Foreign Language or a score of two or higher on the foreign language placement test. If a student in the Elementary Education program is not exempted from the foreign language requirement through the foreign language placement test, additional courses may be required to meet all Carolina Core components.
- 6. Information for the Praxis Core exam can be found on the College of Education, Office of Student Services website.
- 7. Must meet all professional program and internship admissions requirements by set deadlines prior to participation in these courses. Professional program and internship admission requirements can be found on the Bulletin.
- 8. For admission to EDEL 490, a GPA of 3.00 or higher is required in EDEL 440, 450, 460, 471 and 431.

Program Notes:

- Courses designated as "critical" (!) must be taken in the semester in which they are listed.
- All undergraduate students must take a 3-credit course or its equivalent with a passing grade that covers the founding documents. This course may fulfill any requirement in the program of study. Courses that meet this requirement are listed in the academic bulletin.
- Upon completion of 60 hours of course work, including courses specified by the Elem. Education Program, the candidate may apply for admission to the Professional Program in Elem. Education. For admission requirements to the Professional Program, please visit the Bulletin.
- Students in the Department of Instruction and Teacher Education will be allowed to repeat one time only, one course offered through a department in the College of Education for which an unsatisfactory grade was earned. If after the first unsatisfactory grade, a student makes an unsatisfactory grade in the repeated course or any other College of Education course, he/she will no longer be eligible to progress in the program.
- All initial teacher licensure programs in the College of Education require extensive field experiences in P-12 schools. All students must read and
 understand the rules and expectations outlined in the Preservice Teacher Education Clinical Experiences Manual. Prior to participating in school field
 experiences, students must have been cleared through a criminal background check and must have a negative test for TB on file with the College of
 Education.
