Curriculum

- **Business and Management Electives or a Minor** - 12-18 credit hours
- **Capstone Project** - 3 credit hours
- **Senior Seminar** - 3 credit hours

Prerequisites and Requirements

To apply for this online degree program, students must have earned an associate's degree in engineering technology from one of our partner technical colleges or any ABET-accredited two-year program, with a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA in all previous college-level coursework. Students transferring to the program are encouraged to review the list of completed coursework needed for eligibility on the program's webpage.
