Internal Management of KPIC

- a. Hiring KPIC Chair; Replacement/Restructuring of KPIC Chair position; Recruit 2 CPOS/KPIC faculty members
- b. Implement/achieve Strategic Plan items
 - i. Bring KPIC's website under the COP's website by August 2022.
 - ii. Finalize "Alumni Grants" structure and process by May 2023.
 - iii. Determine process for cataloging and identifying innovative experiential sites by June 2023
 - iv. Determine process for identifying and recognizing innovative preceptors.

Student Programs & PharmD Curriculum

- c. Maintain and grow student programs; Grow student involvement with KPIC programs (Career Enhancement, B&E Track, Competition, events, scholarships)
- d. Revamp student programs accordingly to comply with COVID19 policies
- e. Revamp Business and Entrepreneurship Program; Develop assessments to be used to evaluate the B&E program by June 2023.
- f. Offer at least one Kennedy Series Lecture event (target of one per semester)
- g. Update KPIC B&E blackboard page to a general center page, add all students, and implement tracking of views.
- h. Implement new Business Plan Competition format.

- k. Implement Leadership (Fall 2023 – Ballou) and Design Thinking (Spring 2024 – Fabel) activities that will be incorporated into the Professional Development Course in the 2023-2024 academic year.
 - i. Conduct a research project around design thinking in pharmacy education.

Sterile Compounding Programs

- q. Revamp Sterile Compounding programs to comply with COVID19 policies and reaccredit through ACPE
- r. Conduct at least 6 sterile compounding trainings between August 2022 and July 2023.
- s. Increase the offerings of sterile compounding training programs:
 - i. Goal of 9 sterile compounding trainings between August 2023 and July 2024.
 - ii. Pilot the feasibility/sustainability of taking our live courses “on the road” (offering them in another location – hospital pays for instructors to travel to them to train individuals)
 - iii. Begin building library of virtual asynchronous CE courses/programs – goal of at least 6 (< 2-hour programs) by July 2024
 - iv. Increase the number of Subject Matter Experts who can teach our programs or serve as speakers for our programs – paid via honorariums rather than hired by the University

Internal Management of KPIC

- a. Completed – hired Chair in 2020; restructured position in 2021; and hired another individual in 2022; the position has been filled 29 out of the 60 months during this 5 year time period.
- b. Partially completed – KPICs website and communications were combined with the college’s in 2022; the “alumni grants” discussion was halted due to budget reasons in late 2022; initial

discussions/brainstorming regarding identifying and recognizing experiential sites and preceptors were held; however, they have been deferred due to ACT/CPEPN wanting to take the lead nationally

- c. Completed – see table below
- d. Completed – student events/programs were adjusted in 2020-2021 while COVID restrictions were in place; the restrictions were removed in 2022
- e. Partially completed – the B&E program was revamped in 2022; however, student participation and completion remain low. It will be revamped again during the 2024-2025 academic year.

- g. Completed – the B&E program blackboard page was updated in 2023 to the “KPIC Student Programs & Resources” page and tracking was turned on
- h. Completed – the Business Plan Competition was updated during the 2023-2024 academic year; our student team has placed in the top 3 nationally 2 years in a row: 2022 and 2023.
- i. Completed – see attached dashboards from the 2022-2023 (only April-June 2023) and 2023-2024 academic years

Community-Based Pharmacy Residency Program

- l. Ongoing – 4 years of accreditation was achieved in fall 2019; KPIC faculty continue to serve as RPD for the program (program oversight, recruitment/selection/onboarding of new residents, resident evaluation & progression, preceptor development, managing accreditation process, etc.)
- m. Completed – Tessa Hastings helps with residency projects; Abby Will helped with preceptor development; Jordan Ballou became RPD in 2023
- n. Ongoing – residency specific Instagram page was created in 2023, our program has showcased at 4 additional events during the residency year for the past 2 years; however, interest in residency programs and community-based residency programs are down nationally.
- o. Completed – one year accreditation received for Southwire site in 2022
- p. Completed – one additional year accreditation was received for all 3 programs in 2023

Sterile Compounding Programs

- q. Completed – our sterile compounding programs were updated in 2021 to comply with the University’s COVID-19 policies
- r. Partially completed – 4 sterile compounding programs were held in 2022-2023 and another 4 programs were held in 2023-2024
- s. Progressing – 4 sterile compounding programs were held in 2023-2024; several had to be canceled due to low enrollment; our director of sterile compounding position was eliminated in fall 2023 and NABP stopped advertising/promoting our programs in 2024

Practice Transformation / Innovation Projects

- t. Completed – DHEC/SCPhA grants changed in February of 2020; the Integrating Pharmacists into Primary Care program was developed and offered starting in 2021; three pilot programs were held in late 2021 and 2022; posters were presented at APHA (public health) 2021, AMCP 2022, and NABP 2023; a manuscript has been submitted to 4 journals and rejected from 3
- u. Completed – served as a Flip the Pharmacy Coach in 2019-2020; residents served as coaches and site leads until 2023

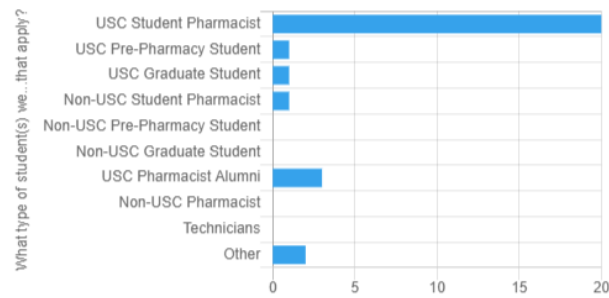

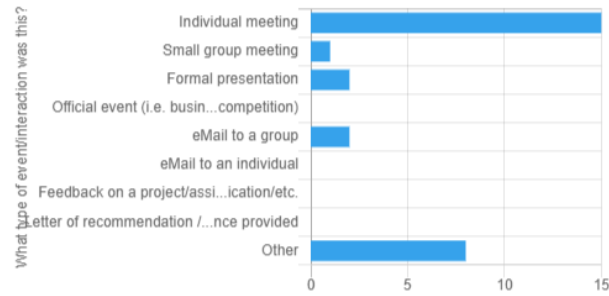
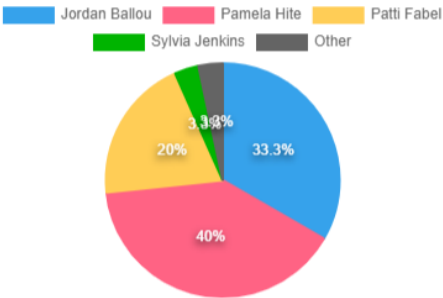
